Training.

My undergraduate training was at St Bartholomew's Hospital, London University. I did a BSc (Hons) degree in Physiology in 1974 at London University and then proceeded to my clinical studies at St Bartholomew's Hospital. I graduated in 1977 with the degree of MBBS. I then spent four months working in a mission hospital in South Africa before starting my pre-registration house officer appointment, initially in London and thereafter in Hemel Hempstead (my London appointment was in vascular and general surgery and orthopaedic surgery and my appointment in Hemel Hempstead in general medicine). In 1979 I worked for six months in the Accident and Emergency Department at St Bartholomew's Hospital as an SHO. The following year I became a Junior Lecturer in Anatomy at St Bartholomew's Hospital, where I taught anatomy to medical students and gained my primary FRCS (England) diploma. I then did a two-year surgical SHO rotation in neurosurgery, orthopaedic surgery, urology and general surgery. In 1983 I obtained my FRCS (England). Thereafter I became a General Surgical Registrar at Harold Wood Hospital in Essex. In 1984 I gained my first Orthopaedic Registrar appointment at Ipswich Hospital. In 1985 I joined the Orthopaedic Registrar rotation at the Westminster Hospital. Within that rotation I worked at St Stephen's Hospital in Chelsea and Queen Mary's Hospital, Roehampton. In 1987 I took a year out of clinical practice as a Medical Research Council Training Fellow at Northwick Park Hospital, where I worked under the auspices of Dr Jonathan Reeve. This was a year of research into bone turnover in osteoporosis and orthopaedics. I also wrote several papers in regard to general orthopaedics and hip fractures. Thereafter I was appointed as a Senior Registrar at the Westminster Hospital. This rotation took me to Queen Mary's Hospital, Roehampton, the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, University College Hospital, Great Ormond St., and the Whittington Hospital in North London. I was accredited as a Specialist in Orthopaedic Surgery in 1991 and was appointed to the post of Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at the East Gloucestershire NHS Trust in September 1991. I started my appointment as a Consultant Orthopaedic and Trauma Surgeon with an interest in shoulder surgery at Cheltenham General Hospital on the 2nd January 1992. I developed my interest in shoulder and elbow surgery during my appointment at Cheltenham General Hospital. I retired from NHS practice in June 2017, but continued to work privately at Nuffield Health Cheltenham and the Imaging Centre Cheltenham, seeing private patients, until April 2021. My GMC status changed from Licenced Practitioner to Registered Practitioner on 14.12.2021, since I no longer perform operations. I am continuing with my medico-legal practice.

I have an extensive experience of medico-legal practice and have been preparing orthopaedic medical reports since the mid-1980's and have prepared over 19000 reports to date. My ratio of work is presently sixty-three per cent joint expert, twelve per cent claimant and twenty-five per cent defendant. I have given oral evidence in Court on a number of occasions. Prior to the Woolfe Reforms I was doing so approximately six times a year though this is much less frequently required at the present. My medico-legal practice is based both in London, Cheltenham, Cardiff, Birmingham, Derby, Manchester, Durham and Emsworth. I undertake medico-legal clinics in London most Saturdays.

I have been engaged in medical negligence cases for the last 20 years. I see about 5 to 10 medical negligence cases a year. The vast majority of the Claimant I see are personal injury cases and to a lesser extent, disability assessments.

During the Covid-19 pandemic I have been holding a number of Zoom/WhatsApp remote consultations for suitable medico-legal cases but have now returned to mainly face-to-face consultations. I am available for domiciliary medico-legal consultations. I had my booster Pfizer Covid vaccination in October 2021.

I relinquished my GMC Licence to Practice on 14th December 2021, since I no longer treat patients or do operations (I retired from operating in April 2021) and have changed my GMC status from Licenced Practitioner to Registered Practitioner.
